01 Document review & due diligence

A single M&A transaction can generate 50,000–200,000 documents. AI-assisted review cuts timelines by 40–70% while improving consistency. Senior attorneys shift from spot-checking to focusing on exceptions that actually matter to the deal.

02 Contract analysis at scale

Extracting key terms, flagging non-standard clauses, identifying risk across hundreds of vendor agreements. A task that consumed 15–20 hours of associate time now takes 2–3 hours of attorney oversight. The role shifts from reading to advising.

03 Legal research acceleration

Summarizing holdings, identifying precedents, synthesizing jurisdictional differences. AI doesn't replace the attorney's analysis — it compresses the time to reach it. Cognitive load of information gathering decreases; capacity for analysis increases.

04 Multi-jurisdictional practice

Firms operating across multiple jurisdictions use AI to surface regulatory differences systematically. A 50-state survey that once took 6 hours is now an initial framework in minutes — the attorney validates and refines, not builds from scratch.

The cognitive focus problem

Large firm practice involves constant context-switching. Attorneys move between client matters, administrative tasks, communication, and billable work dozens of times per day.

Research shows that returning to deep work after an interruption takes 15–25 minutes. Multiply that across a dozen transitions per day and you've lost hours of productive capacity that never shows up in time entries — but absolutely shows up in attorney burnout and client results.

AI tools that handle first-pass work — document triage, research summaries, initial drafts — reduce the number of low-value tasks requiring attorney attention. Fewer interruptions. More sustained focus. Better work.

This isn't just about technical skills. It's about workflow integration, change management, and realistic expectations. Attorneys who understand what AI can and cannot do will use it effectively. Those who expect magic will disengage.

4 Do you have a high-ROI roadmap?
